Chapter 1- Liberty Derrick

Liberty Derrick is about 100 years old and was used in the mid-1900's for granite quarrying by the Liberty Granite company. This 85 foot tall derrick acts like a crane, lifting and loading up to 20,000 pounds of payload. The derrick was restored in 2006 using timber from 110 year old Douglas Fir.



Chapter 2- The Derrick House

The Derrick House is a small wooden shack housing the drum hoists and brakes that control the derrick's mast, boom arm and hook. An operator sits in the shack controlling the derrick based on signals provided by a second operator standing outside.



Chapter 3- Quarry Artifacts

Artifacts left from quarrying days include a granite cutting saw, polished Red Granite pillars, metal skips, and waste rock. Plugs and Feathers were used to split and separate large pieces of stone.
